

V. CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

4.6 Conclusion

1. According to the results of the research, the implementation of the Government Purchase Price (GPP) policy for grain by the Perum Bulog Mojokerto Area in Jetis District has been carried out through systematic stages in accordance with applicable policy guidelines. In the communication aspect, Bulog conducts socialization to farmers through coordination with Agricultural Extension Center of Jetis District, farmer coordinators, and village officials so that information related to GPP prices and absorption mechanisms can be understood by farmers. In terms of resources, the implementation is supported by procurement human resources, warehouse facilities, and grain transportation mechanisms, although there are still limitations in the capacity of dryers, makloon partners and harvesting equipment. In terms of disposition, the implementer shows a commitment to absorbing grain according to the price that has been set by the government. Meanwhile, in the aspect of bureaucratic structure, the implementation has followed clear SOP and a structured coordination flow.
2. Factors that affect the effectiveness of GPP policy implementation include clear communication to farmers, sufficiency of resources (human resources and infrastructure), commitment of policy implementers, and bureaucratic coordination between related parties. The results of the analysis show that these factors simultaneously affect the effectiveness of policy implementation. The level of effectiveness of the implementation of the grain GPP policy in Jetis District is in the category of quite effective which is reviewed from the accuracy of the policy, the accuracy of implementation and the accuracy of the target. This

policy is able to increase the selling price of grain at the farmer level and provide income protection, Although optimization is still needed so that the benefits can be felt more evenly and sustainably.

5.2 Suggestions

1. Exploration of other variables in the effectiveness of GPP policy implementation. Future research can examine the influence of the addition of other variables such as; (1) Technical difficulties and (2) Diversity of target group behavior.
2. The next research is suggested to expand the study area at the district or provincial level in order to obtain a comparative picture of the effectiveness of the implementation of the GPP policy.
